ROYERSFORD BOROUGH RECYCLING PROGRAM

Royersford Borough has contracted with Whitetail Disposal to collect your recyclables. Their contact number is: 610-936-9967. Recyclables are collected every Tuesday. Please refer to your Borough calendar for holiday schedules. Customers of Whitetail Disposal can enjoy single-stream recycling; all of your recyclables can be placed together in the same container. No paper and commingle sorting required.

Recyclable: (ALL ITEMS ARE TO BE EMPTY AND RINSED)

- Aluminum/tin cans
- Brown paper bags
- Clean cardboard boxes, broken down into 2ft.x2ft. bundles
- Glass bottles, lids removed if different material (clear, green, or brown, unbroken glass)
- #1 #7 plastics, lids removed if different material (plastics #1-2 preferred)
- Newsprint, magazines, catalogs, brochures, envelopes, junk mail, office/school papers, construction paper, paperback books, phone books

Not Recyclable:

- Aluminum foil
- Batteries
- Broiler pans
- Cake/pie plates/ovenware
- Ceramic cups/plates
- Clothing hangers (plastic or aluminum)
- Crystal
- Cups with wax or plastic coatings (their plastic lids are also not recyclable)
- Drinking glasses
- Electronics (including compact discs & DVDs)
- Flexible packaging (i.e., Flexible packaging like chip bags and juice or soup pouches cannot be recycled in curbside programs. This type of packaging is made from multiple materials preventing it from being recycled.)
- Flower pots
- Food Waste
- Hazardous chemical containers (including paint cans, oil cans/bottles)
- Light bulbs
- Mirrors
- Non-broken-down boxes
- Packing materials (e.g., packing peanuts)
- Plastic toys
- Pet food bags
- Pizza boxes
- Plastic bags (Plastic bags are not accepted as part of curbside recycling programs they get tangled in equipment and threaten worker safety. Plastic bags can be recycled at most grocery stores.)





- Plastic wrap & film (Plastic wrap, bubble wrap, sandwich bags and freezer bags should not go in the recycle bin. Reuse whenever possible for presents, moving, or storage of similar items, or look for local options to recycle.)
- Polystyrene foam or plastic (Styrofoam, plastic "to-go" containers and cups are made of nonrecyclable materials, and are not acceptable in the curbside recycling program. Packing peanuts aren't recyclable either, however some shipping stores will take peanuts back for reuse.)
- Shredded paper
- Steel
- Tyvek plastic envelopes
- Waxed cardboard
- Windows
- Yard Waste
